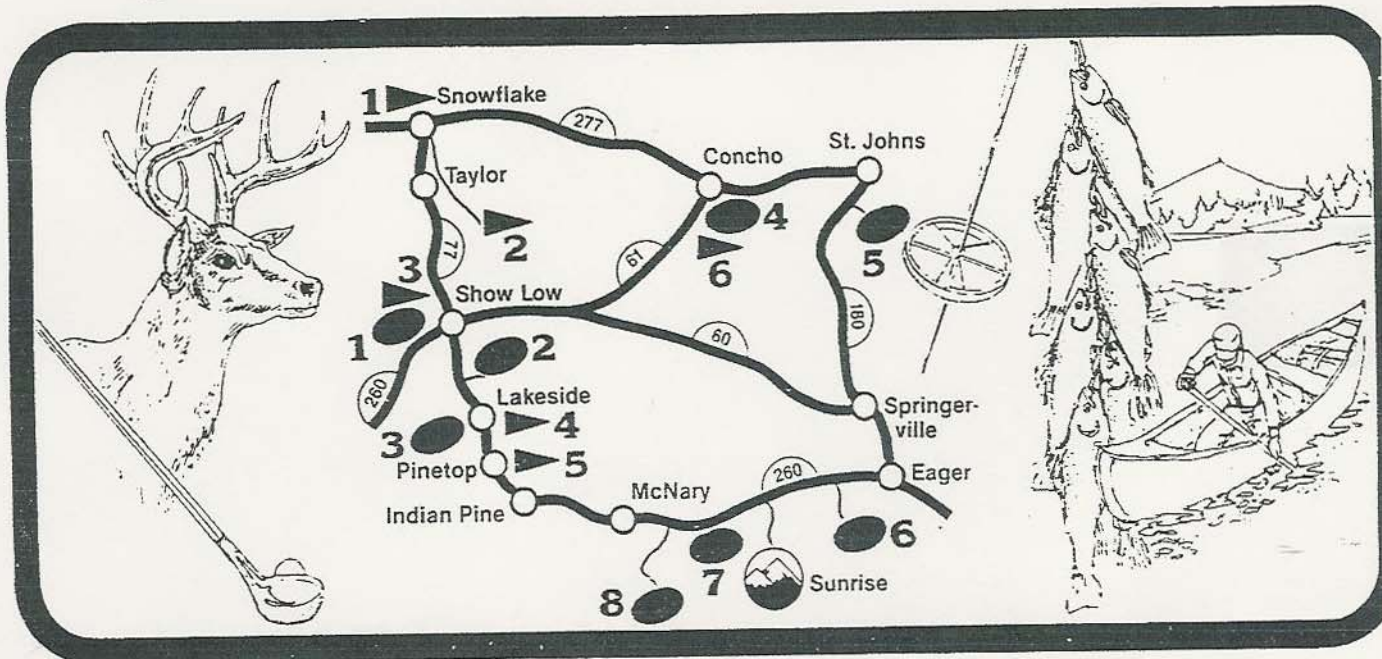


Super times for the sports-minded!



Lakes The White Mountains region sparkles with lakes — at least four dozen of special interest. We've singled out eight here: all top fishing spots, all in the general area of First United properties:

- 1. Fool's Hollow** A dandy fishing find. Good access just off Highway 60. 250 acres. Launch area, restrooms. Trout, bass, catfish — and they'll try anything!
- 2. Show Low** Kids' and oldtimers' favorite — surprises galore in mixed bag of species! Paved-road access off Highway 260. 100 acres. Boat and motor rentals, restrooms. Trout (stocked), bass, catfish, bluegill, bullhead, pike, shore, boat — plenty room to roam!
- 3. Rainbow** Good-sized and productive reservoir body. Paved-road access (right thru) via Highway 260. 80 acres. Boat and motor rentals, store, launch area. Trout, bass, sunfish, catfish. Weeds suggest boat and floating baits: upper lake best.
- 4. Concho** A trophy-trout site, always high in the derbies. Paved-road access off Highway 61. Launch area. Bait and flies best: late daylight hours usually most productive.
- 5. Lyman** 600-acre biggie with a trout-famed past. Paved-road access off Highway 180. State Park, store, restrooms, boat and motor rentals, launch area. Bass, catfish, pike, occasional rainbow and brown.

- 6. Mexican Hay** Shallow, weedy, but worth the lures for limits of trout! Just a hop off Highway 180. 35 acres. Particularly good fly fishing lake. A small sleeper!
- 7. A-1** Surprisingly, named after an Indian (nicknamed A-1 by the Army). Access via paved Highway 260. 24 acres. Good fishing from shore, waist-waders, cartoppers, canoes. Trout, panfish. Late daylight best.
- 8. Hawley** Hawley On the Apache Reservation. Paved-road access off Highway 260. 300 acres. Store, boat rentals, stables. Hot rainbow fishing, best via casting/trotting from boat: some good shore spots.

Golf Good courses abound throughout the White Mountains region — many open to the public, otherwise usually quite reasonable on membership costs. Six of the best are a convenient spin from most First United properties. They are:

1. Snowflake CC
2. Silver Creek CC
3. Show Low CC
4. Lakeside CC
5. Pinetop CC
6. Concho CC

Skiing Sunrise Arizona's premier skiing resort and a regional standout. 3 mountains, 7 lifts, over 60 trails. Lodge, restaurant, bar, rentals, repairs, instruction, more. This complex has it all, gets better every year and features the first, last and best snow in the state.

Wildlife The White Mountains region is a hunters'/photographers'/birdwatchers' paradise! We won't even attempt to list songbirds, shorebirds and waterfowl — over 150 species are regular visitors. Even major game categories defy detailed listing so we'll be brief:
